

Key Components



3 Types of Delivery

- ✓ Teaching is possibly the best way to solidify knowledge. There are 3 ways that presentations can be delivered.
- ✓ Demonstration (doing, showing how, making)
- Illustrated Talk (talking, telling how, charts, pictures)
- ✓ Formal Speech (share information without, visuals and



Individual or Team?

4-H'ers can present as an individual...

<u>OR</u>

- As a team of 2 only (no more)
- ✓ If team members are in 2 different age groups they will present in the oldest age group
- Presentations 101
- **Help with videos**

Terms & Process - Presentations for 2021 will be completed in video format

- ✓ County Activity Day "CAD": Low pressure / Youth present live in front of local judges and peers / Gold and Silver winners in all age groups move on to district competition /
- ✓ **District Activity Day "DAD":** Youth from all 22 counties within the Northeast District (NED) Compete against each other / Gold winners in all 3 age groups: 8-10, 11-13, 14-18 & Silver winners in 11-13 14-18 move on to State Finals
- ✓ **State Finals:** Usually takes place at NCSU on the first day of NC 4-H Congress (but will be virtual for 2021) / All NC Districtict compete

- ✓ May 10 / <u>CAD Registration</u> Deadline
- ✓ May 15 / CAD (In Person, County-Level Presentations)
- May 25 / DAD (Videos Must Be Submitted to Jerry)
- ✓ June 18 / DAD for Outdoor Cookery (The only F2F component offered in 2021)
- June 24 / Judging for DAD Occurs

3 Steps To Presentations Mastery

Step 1

Select A Category

Remember middle school when you had to do reports on whatever topic the teacher decided? Well... Not here.

Presentation Regulations

Step 2

Practice & Engage

Have fun with this, be silly, and creative.

Practice at your club meetings or in front of family. Make your mistakes early, when they don't count against you.

Be an active participant in our workshops

Step 3

Present! (Finish What You Start)

This is **less about how well youth place** in competition and more about what **kind of communicator they become during this process**.

At the end of face to face presentations, judges often engage in a short question and answer segment with the 4-H'ers.
